



EIGHT COMMON SOURCES OF WATER POLLUTION

- 1.Oil and other chemicals dripping from vehicles
- 2. Hosing off driveways and washing cars outside
- 3. Dog waste
- 4. Paint, oil, and other harmful chemicals disposed of down the storm drain
- 5. Litter
- 6. Sweeping leaf litter and lawn debris into the street
- 7. Grass clippings entering storm drains
- 8. Overuse of fertilizer and other lawn chemicals

EIGHT SOLUTIONS TO PREVENT WATER POLLUTION

- 1. Be sure to keep vehicles in good working order so they don't drip harmful chemicals onto roadways.
- 2. Use a broom and dustpan to remove debris from your driveway and dispose of it in a trash bin. Wash your car in a commercial car wash or on the lawn where soap can be absorbed into the grass.
- 3. Dispose of pet waste in trash receptacles.
- 4. Douglas and Sarpy county residents can properly dispose of household hazardous waste at UnderTheSink.
- 5. Pick up litter when you see it and tie trash bags closed to reduce escaped trash.
- 6. Mulch leaf litter and lawn debris into your yard or dispose of it with your yard waste.
- 7. Sweep grass clippings off sidewalks and streets, mulch them to create natural fertilizers for your yard, or bag your grass clippings for disposal with yard waste.
- 8. Use products as directed and be sure to sweep excess chemicals off sidewalks and streets. When possible, choose organic, non-toxic products for outdoor use.
