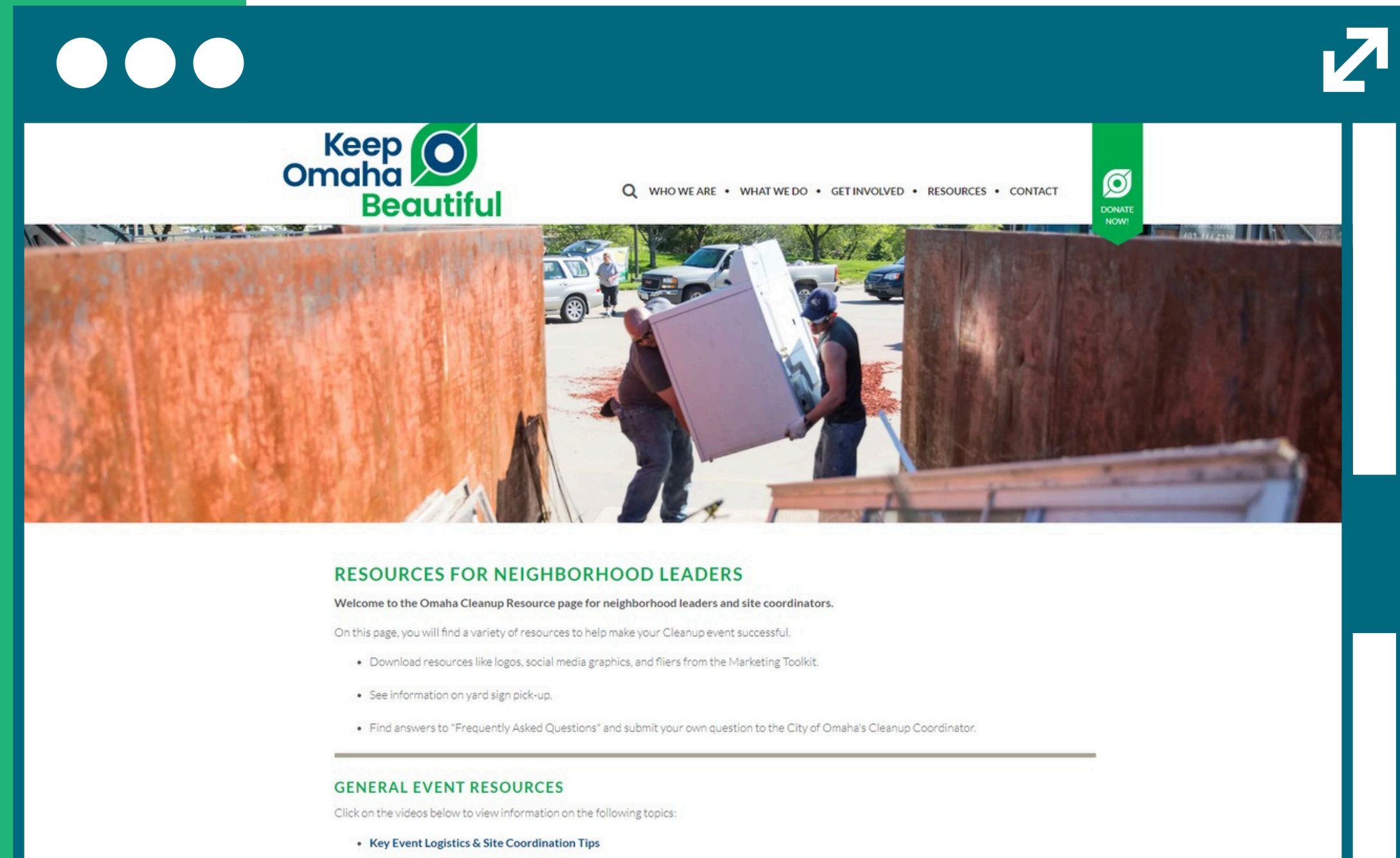

▶▶ GIS Map of site locations

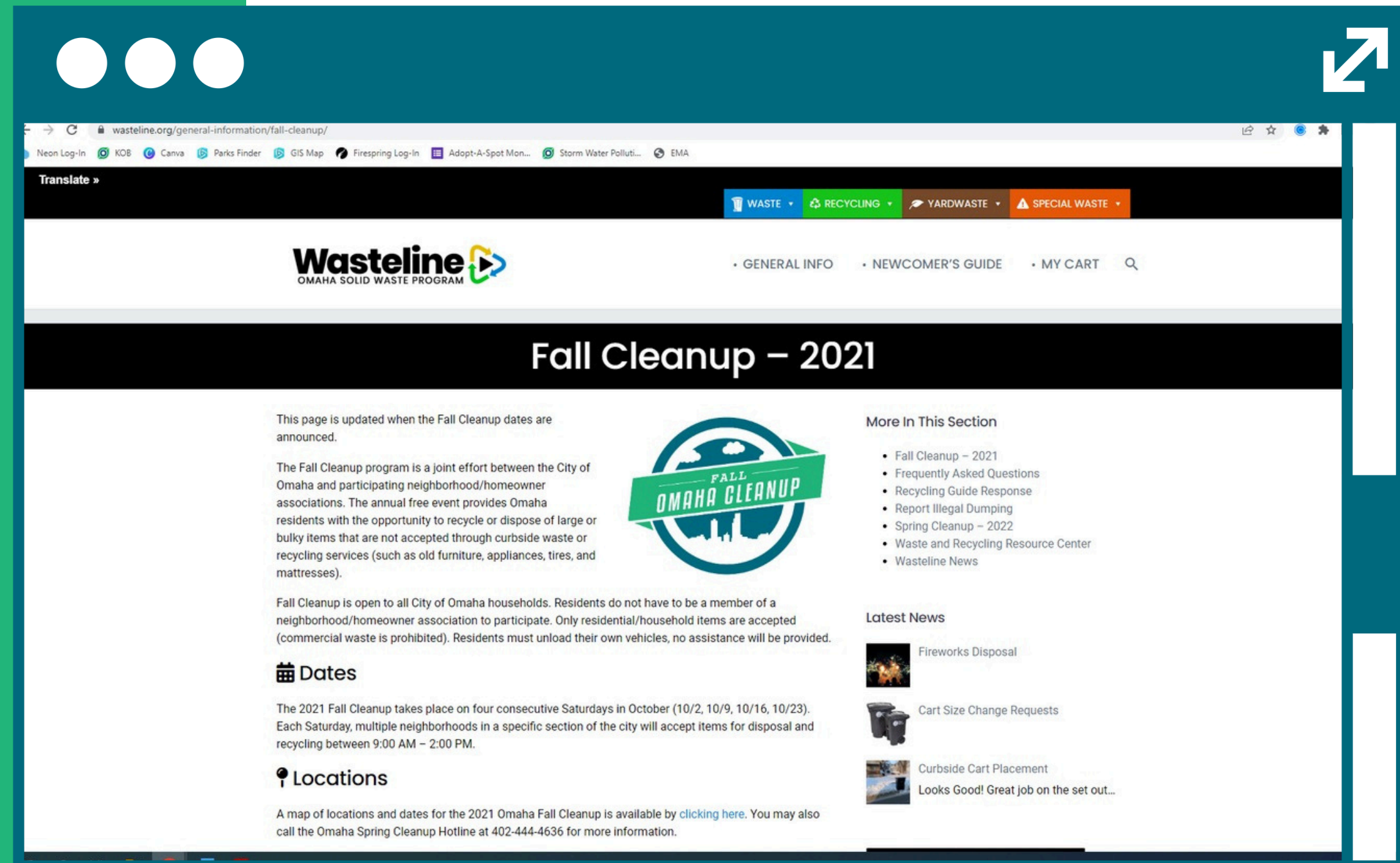

EVENT LOGISTICS



DAY OF **TIMETABLE**

7:45AM - 3:00PM

Arrive prior to 8am and staff volunteers through 3pm

8:00AM

Meet with truck driver & your recycling and reuse vendors (if previously arranged)

8:00AM - 8:30AM

Meet the City Inspector to receive your safety cones, vests, and event packet

9:00AM - 2:00PM

Accept items starting at 9:00 AM and cut off the line at 2:00 PM



Event goes on rain or shine. Make a plan for severe weather, such as a tornado or thunderstorm.



EVENT PACKET

You'll receive an event packet from your inspector the day of cleanup.



- ➔ Address sheets for appliance, tire, battery, and yardwaste sites
- ➔ Name & contact for City Inspector
- ➔ UnderThe Sink Brochures (open 9am - 2pm, no appt. necessary)
- ➔ Sign noting prohibited items

WHEN TO CONTACT YOUR CITY INSPECTOR

You'll meet your inspector the day of cleanup.



- ➔ You encounter a challenging resident or situation
- ➔ Your line gets overly long and you receive a very large load
- ➔ Truck driver or loading issues
- ➔ Run low on address sheets

PROHIBITED ITEMS

No business waste (only residential)

No tires or rims

No pressurized/propane tanks

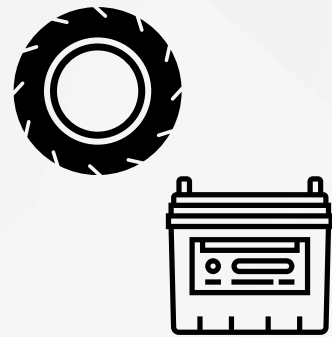

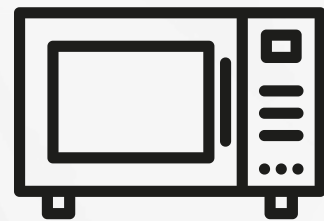

ABOUT YARDWASTE

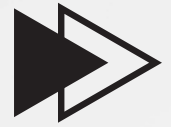
- Unlimited curbside yardwaste collection will take place October 4th – October 25th
- Grass clippings, leaves, and small branches (under 2" in diameter) are accepted at Al Veys Park, 6606 S 60th St, during Omaha Cleanup Saturdays
- PROHIBITED ITEMS: Stumps & Trunks



ABOUT **UNDERTHE SINK**

Open 9–2pm, no appointment necessary on Omaha
Cleanup Saturdays





Do not accept items before 9:00am



Cut off the line at 2:00pm



Truck drivers are not contracted to help unload items. Residents are expected to unload their own materials.



At the end of the event: clean up debris, return safety cones and vests to the City Inspector, collect yard signs and keep for reuse, and complete the online survey the following Monday

VOLUNTEER ROLES

Greeters (1-2)

Greet cars, hand out brochures & directions to special collection sites

Traffic Control (2-3)

Line Managers (1-2)

Inform residents of wait time, check for prohibited items

Extra Help (3-4)

Provide breaks, help with recycling efforts

VOLUNTEER SAFETY



Residents are expected to unload their own materials



Set up a safe check-in site, equipped with water, shade, and chairs



Provide volunteers with a safety vest

If your neighborhood or association is interested in conducting a litter cleanup in conjunction with your fall cleanup weekend, supplies are available.

RECYCLING & REUSE **OPPORTUNITIES**





Check out KOB's [Recycling and Reuse Guide](#) to see a list of vendors that have confirmed their willingness to work with you. Or, reach out to your own metal, electronic, plastic, or donation vendors.



Confirm date, time, and location with your vendors. They should arrive at 8am to set-up.



None of the organizations provided are officially endorsed by KOB or the City of Omaha. You have final authority on if items are donated to any vender on the day of your cleanup.



Please note:

Appliance sites cannot host a metal recycler

- Vendors are not required, but encouraged
- It is the site's responsibility to reach out to vendors. The vendors listed on the Recycling and Reuse Guide understand their participation is by invitation or prior arrangement only.
- If you identify a good vendor that should be added to the list next year please provide KOB with their contact information.
