GO AHEAD, RECYCLE IT!



CARDBOARD



- Flatten boxes
- Remove plastic & foam
- Tape & labels are OK



PAPER & PAPERBOARD

- Newspapers, cereal boxes, magazines
- Envelopes with plastic windows



METAL CANS

- Rinse & dry
- Labels are OK



PLASTIC BOTTLES, JUGS, & TUBS

- Plastic containers: #1, #2, #3, #5
- Rinse & dry
- Keep lids on



CARTONS

- Juice boxes, milk cartons, soup boxes
- Rinse & dry
- Keep caps on



NOT SO FAST. KEEP IT OUT!

These items are NOT accepted in City of Omaha curbside recycling carts or drop-off site containers:



SOFT FLEXIBLE PLASTIC

Plastic bags, plastic wrap, chip bags, food wrappers



HOUSEHOLD **HAZARDOUS WASTE**

Garden & automotive chemicals, rechargeable batteries, cleaning products



ELECTRONICS

Computers, cell phones, anything else with a cord or cable



FOOD WASTE & DISPOSABLE TABLEWARE

Food scraps, plastic utensils, straws, paper plates, paper napkins



MISCELLANEOUS

Styrofoam, toys, clothing, wood, anything smaller than a post-it note

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO WITH GLASS?

Glass can ONLY be recycled at one of the 8 glass recycling drop-off sites in Omaha, and should NOT be placed in your green-lid curbside recycling cart.
