



PARTICIPATE IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD'S SPRING CLEANUP!

ACCEPTED MATERIALS & SPECIAL ITEMS

DESCRIPTION & ELIGIBILITY

The Omaha Spring Cleanup is a joint effort between the City of Omaha and your neighborhood. The free event provides Omaha residents with the opportunity to properly dispose of and recycle large or bulky items that are not typically accepted through your curbside trash and recycling service, such as broken furniture, appliances, and mattresses. You do not have to be an official member of your neighborhood or homeowner association to participate.

You can bring approved bulky materials to your neighborhood site on the date and time noted below. Appliances and lead acid batteries are accepted as part of the Omaha Spring Cleanup, but they are considered "special regulated items" so they may have collection sites that differ from your neighborhood location. See below for details. Yardwaste will only be collected at City of Omaha Oma-Gro Compost Receiving Facility (former Al Veys Park), 6502 S 60th St. **Please note that tires will no longer be collected as part of this event. A new, separate tire collection will be announced.**

PROHIBITED ITEMS

The following items are NOT ACCEPTED at the Omaha Spring Cleanup: **tires, rocks, concrete, commercial waste, and any items that can be collected via your curbside trash and recycling service.** Toxic materials (*paint, oil, pesticides, and other chemicals*) are also NOT ACCEPTED and should be taken to the **UnderTheSink** facility near 120th & I Streets (UnderTheSink.org). UnderTheSink is open 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Omaha Clean Up Saturdays.
